

Pre-Masters programme, 2010

This programme is designed for postgraduates who need to improve their level of English and their ability to study in English before starting a post graduate degree.

The programme consists of General and Academic English, preparation for IELTS, and a One-to-One tutorial programme with one session of 50 minutes every week. This consists of a task-based programme of research work and assignments in the students' chosen subject, with feedback and help from a tutor.

Because the subject related content is taught on a One-to-One basis, we can offer a wide range of subjects including Art and Design, Business, Economics, Journalism, Law, Marketing, Media and Film Studies, Tourism and Hospitality, Social Sciences and many others.

Maximum class size: 15/1

Lessons per week: 21 * plus 1 One-to-One session of 50 minutes every week

Timetable: 9.00-13.00 or 9.00-12.00 and 14.00-15.00 plus a One-to-One tutorial programme

Course length: 12, 24 or 36 weeks

Entry requirement: 12 week course, IELTS 6; 24 week course, IELTS 5.5; 36 week course, IELTS 5. Applicants also need to have a first degree.

Start dates: Every month by arrangement**

Minimum age: 21

Course content

General English and Extra Conversation: The course develops all your practical communication skills, with special emphasis on speaking, pronunciation and listening. By learning and practising new language in imaginative and structured lessons, you achieve greater fluency in everyday English. This includes grammar, vocabulary, colloquial English and idioms. Extra Conversation and develop your speaking skills in a friendly, informal atmosphere. You will discuss interesting topics with time for correction and feedback.

IELTS Preparation: Thorough preparation for the examination: essay writing, fluent and accurate speaking, describing and interpreting graphs and charts and practice in reading and listening skills. You will also learn specific strategies to improve your examination performance, with comprehensive examination practice and feedback from your teacher. You can take the examination in the week following the end of your course.

Academic English: You will learn the language skills required for academic study, such as summarising lectures, note-taking skills, essay writing, debating techniques, carrying out research and presenting data and using the Internet where appropriate. Students are encouraged to discover the learning strategies that suit them best, so that they can learn more effectively.

One-to-One tutorial programme: The content depends on the post-graduate field of study. The aim is to improve use of English in the chosen subject area

Example study plans

12-week course:

4 weeks General English (advanced level) and Academic English

8 weeks IELTS Preparation

12 x One-to-One tutorials, 1 every week, time by arrangement

24-week course:

16 weeks General English and Extra Conversation/Academic English

8 weeks IELTS Preparation

24 x One-to-One tutorials, 1 every week, time by arrangement

36-week course:

28 weeks General English and Extra Conversation/Academic English

8 weeks IELTS Preparation

36 x One-to-One tutorials, 1 every week, time by arrangement

University Placement Service

Students have free access to our university placement service during their course. The following services are offered:

- Counselling to choose a suitable university and course
- Arrangement of visits to selected universities
- Advice on entry requirements and procedures

- Help with completion of application documents
- Help with preparing personal statements and obtaining references

Note that places on popular courses become more difficult to find from spring onwards and we recommend that students arriving at Frances King from May onwards start the application process before they begin their Pre-Masters course.

Holidays

Students may take 2 weeks' holiday after every 12 weeks of completed study, by arrangement, except where a course includes the 2 weeks' school holiday in December. Whenever possible, we will extend course dates when a holiday is taken.
